

“That’s good to know...”

***Q: What are “Quick Visits” and what will I need?**

A: “Quick Visits” is a time for parents to complete administrative business AND for the children to meet their teacher and to see their classroom. Be sure to bring your checkbook to pay for **hot lunches** (money gets put into an account for your child), **PTO dues**, Boy/Girl Scout dues etc. Bring the paperwork you received in the mail and turn it in at the appropriate place (tables are marked). It tends to be less busy first thing in the morning and toward the end. Little children who won't sit in a stroller would be best left at home with a babysitter ,if possible, to help keep your sanity during this very busy time! This day can be a bit overwhelming the first time.

***Q: What happens on school supply pick up day?**

Nativity has a wonderful option of paying a flat fee for all school supplies. Then there is a school supply pick up day (noted in Sunday bulletin) and you pick up the supplies in the school gym. Take them home and write your child’s name on everything. FUN! Bring the supplies with you to Quick Visits and turn in to teacher.

***Q: How do I enter the school building when the doors are locked?**

At the front door there is an intercom button to press and someone in the school office will buzz the door open for you. All visitors must go directly to the school office and sign in before going anywhere else in the school. Visitors cannot enter at the lower lot.

***Q: Where do you park during the school day?**

The parking lot in front of the school is not available for parking during the school day; that is reserved for the children’s’ recess. All parking needs to be on the church side (south side).

*** Q: What time does school start/end?**

School starts at 8 a.m. sharp. You can drop off your child as early at 7:40 a.m. School dismisses at 3:15 p.m..

***Q: What is Spirit Day and what do my children wear?**

A: Spirit Days are once a month (noted on Nativity weekly newsletter calendar). Spirit clothes need to be ordered via PTO in the spring prior to the August start of school. One T-shirt in a slightly larger size would be sufficient to wear all school year and maybe the next. Jeans, regular or capri for girls or uniform pants can be worn on these special out of uniform days. If you did not purchase spirit clothes, send your child to school in a uniform or uniform sweatshirt. Watch for Spirit Day orders forms in the Nativity Newsletter.

***Q: Can I join my child/children for lunch in the cafeteria? Do I need permission? Can I bring in food from a restaurant?**

A: Have lunch with your child anytime you wish and it is not necessary to ask your child's teacher for permission. If you wish to have hot lunch, you need to inform your child what you would like to select for lunch. If your child is in Kindergarten, a note to teacher would be a good idea to ensure accuracy. You may bring in food and drink for your child/children, but please limit it to them. It is always necessary to sign in at the front office before going on to the cafeteria or classroom.

***Q: What are the carpool line procedures?**

A: Arriving before 3:00 pm or after 3:20 may help minimize your wait time. It is also a good time to go through mail or catch up on phone calls...so not a bad idea to bring something to do in the car. ALSO, you will need a carpool colored sheet (get at Quick Visits), print your family’s last name on it and stick it in
